

## **Firm Prepares for Trial in Mississippi Electrocution Case**

Trial is scheduled to begin on May 4, 2009 in Monroe County, Mississippi on claims brought by an individual against Monroe County Electric Power Association. The claims arise from a tragic accident that occurred when a chain used by a log truck driver came into contact with a low hanging power line. The firm will present evidence that shows that the height of the power line was not in compliance with legal requirements and, had it been, the accident would not have occurred.
